

# Chicago Manual of Style Notes and Bibliography Citation Guide!

## Basics

### Book, Bibliography:

Authors Last Name, Authors First Name. *Italicized Title of Book*. City of Publication: Publisher, Year Published.

### Book, Note:

Authors First and Last Name, *Italicized Book Title*, (City of Publication: Publisher, Year Published), page number/s referenced.

### Article, Bibliography:

Authors Last Name, Authors First Name. "Article Title in Quotation Marks." *Italicized Title of Journal*. Journal Edition # (Year of Publication in Parenthesis): Page Numbers.

### Article, Note:

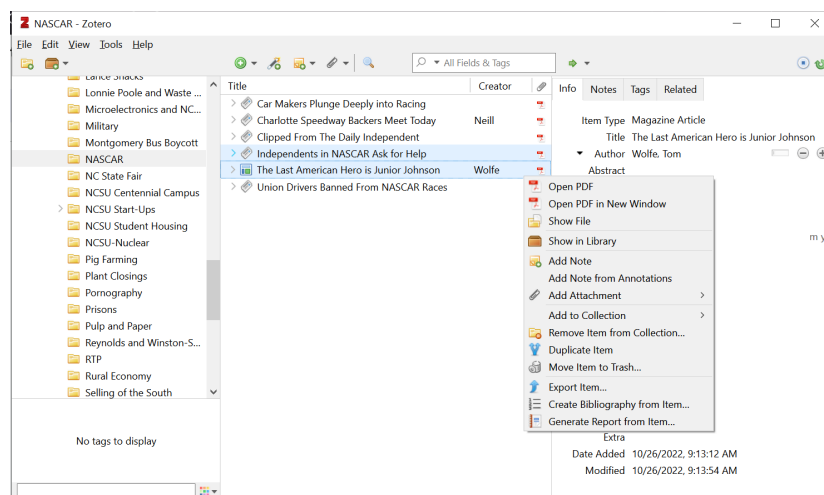
Authors First and Last Name, "Article Title in Quotation Marks," *Italicized Title of Journal*, Journal Edition # (Year of Publication in Parenthesis): Page Numbers Referenced.

- Note the different uses of commas and periods, the different formatting for different sources, and the switching of first and last names of authors.
- Almost every source you find will have an automatic citation generated by the source provider- these are a good place to start, but double check them, format them correctly for your use (notes or bibliography), and add page numbers if relevant.

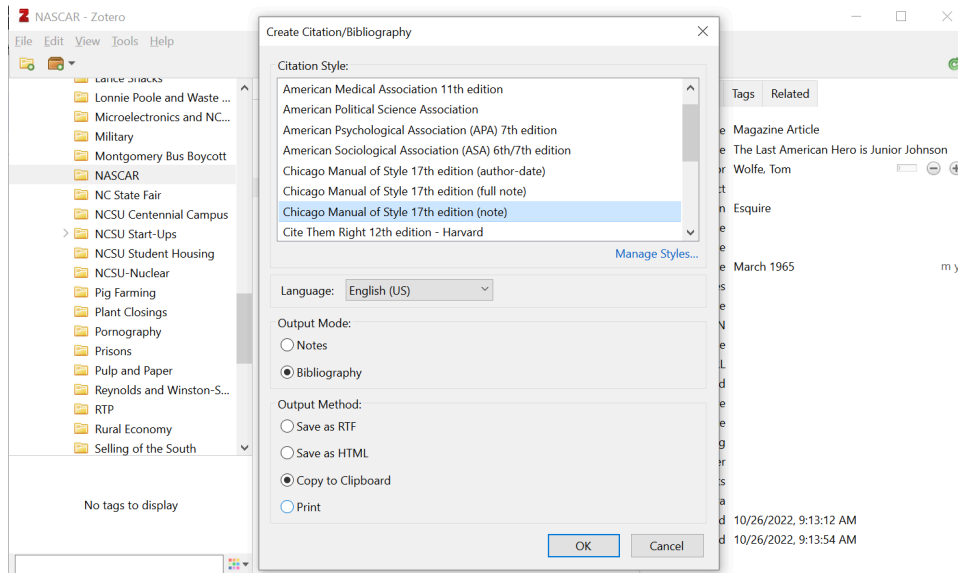

## Using Zotero to Create Citations:



Right click your source and select "create bibliography from item"



Select “Chicago Manual of Style 17th edition, note”

Change the Output Mode to either “Note” or “Bibliography” depending on your need

Select Output Method: “Copy to Clipboard”

Paste your citation in your document!
